Two Agencies in NE Work Hand-in-Hand Against Crime Using Start of the Art App

Sheriff Miller of the Buffalo County Sheriff's Office and Chief Dan Lynch of the Kearney Police Department have teamed up to release the See Something, Send Something app to their communities.

Kearney, NE, June 28, 2018 - Both the Buffalo Sheriff's Office and Kearney Police Department have chosen to implement the See Something, Send Something app to supplement their crime fighting efforts. An excerpt from the agency's website says "The mission of the Buffalo County Sheriff's Department is to enhance the quality of life in our county by working cooperatively with the public and within the framework of the U.S. Constitution to enforce the law, preserve the peace, reduce fear and provide for a safe environment for all of our citizens."



The smart device apps allows law enforcement to set up invisible geofence broadcast notifications that alert community member's smart devices with pertinent information. After receiving information or as part of proactive empowerment, app users can submit tips with pictures, videos or attachments.

"Both agencies assist each other as needed as well as working with law enforcement officers from other local jurisdictions in Buffalo County, Public Safety at the University of Nebraska at Kearney, and the Nebraska State Patrol."
