An excerpt from the agency's website says "A new, free app called See Something Send Something is increasing the ability for law enforcement to more effectively communicate with the public and also allows citizens to easily communicate and send information to law enforcement."



The smart device apps allows law enforcement to set up invisible geofence broadcast notifications that alert community member's smart devices with pertinent information. After receiving information or as part of proactive empowerment, app users can submit tips with pictures, videos or attachments.

The app also boasts an anonymous or self-identified chat feature that will increase communications between police and the community. "Anything that helps us better communicate with the public is a good thing," said Chief Mike Cantaloupe. "We also encourage our residents to use the app to communicate information to us," he continued.
